MEASURE C - PURPOSE

The Measure C Citizen's Oversight Committee's main role is to review and monitor the Mendocino Coast Health Care District's spending to ensure it aligns with intended provisions in Measure C. The healthcare parcel tax revenue is kept in a separate account and is designated for emergency room services, attracting and retaining medical staff, maintaining ambulance and 911 services, and providing essential healthcare. No funds may go to administrators' salaries, benefits, or pensions. Approved by a two-thirds majority vote of the residents of the district, the tax is \$144 per parcel per year for 12 years, starting July 1, 2018, with independent oversight to ensure proper use.

The Measure C ballot language describes tax funds to be spent to:

- maintain local emergency room services;
- attract and retain high quality doctors and nurses;
- maintain local ambulance and related 911 services;
- make critical repairs and upgrades to medical equipment/facilities;
- maintain local surgical services; and
- maintain local obstetric services.¹
