**SUBJECT: Measure C Unallocated funds List - 5/1/2025**

### **RECOMMENDATION**

Staff recommends that the Committee approve up to \$2,388,869 from Measure C unallocated funds, as listed on the 5/1/2025 summary, for projects already approved by the MCHCD Board.

### **BACKGROUND**

The role of the Measure C Committee is strictly to assess whether expenditures meet the criteria approved by the voters in the ballot measure. The Committee's responsibility is to verify that funds were used appropriately and to report its findings to the District Board—not to make decisions about which items should be purchased.

The Measure C project list dated 5/1/2025 includes \$6,925,354 in unallocated funds for projects already approved by the MCHCD Board. The Committee approved the full amount at its May 7, 2025 meeting. All items on the list were reasonable, necessary, and equally important to keeping the hospital operating.

The Measure C Committee has \$2,388,869 in unallocated funds, but the list of projects awaiting approval exceeds that amount.

### **ANALYSIS**

A fair way to allocate the unallocated funds is to distribute them across all projects on the pending list based on each project's share of the total cost. This avoids picking favorites and keeps the process objective.

### **FISCAL IMPACT**

No change to Measure C funding or tax uses.
